Second, there is the "attic disco." If you go into your attic during the day and can see beams of sunlight coming through the boards, you have a problem. Unless you installed a skylight you forgot about, those are holes. Holes let in water, bugs, and generally bad vibes.

Third, look out for the "curling iron effect." Shingles should lie flat. If they are curling up at the edges like old sandwiches, they are dried out and useless. They can't stop water anymore; they are just hanging on for dear life.
